FINAL BOW MUSIC



Final Bow Music offers a supportive and inspiring environment where students of all ages can develop their musical skills, creativity, and confidence through collaborative and individualized instruction. Our music program blends strong foundational training with meaningful performance opportunities across a variety of ensembles and disciplines. From children's choirs and adult choir to group piano lab, flute choir, private music lessons, and chamber music opportunities, we emphasize musicianship, technical growth, artistic expression, and the joy of making music together. Through year-round instruction, performances, workshops, and community events, Final Bow Music encourages every student to discover their unique musical voice, build lasting connections, and experience the lifelong rewards of music.

OUR MISSION

Final Bow is a nonprofit organization dedicated to nurturing creativity, confidence, and character in children through high-quality instruction in dance, music, and theatre. We strive to make the performing arts accessible, inclusive, and inspiring — providing a supportive environment where every child can grow as an artist and as an individual.

OUR HISTORY

Final Bow: Center for Children's Performing Arts was founded in December 2013 with a vision to create a welcoming space where children could explore their creativity through dance, music, and theatre. What began as a small dream has grown into a thriving nonprofit arts community that has served hundreds of students over the past 12 years. Rooted in passion, inclusion, and excellence, Final Bow continues to inspire young artists and enrich lives through the power of performance.

CULTURE

At Final Bow, music students are not only learning performance skills — they are building friendships, discovering their voices, and becoming part of a supportive artistic family that cheers them on both onstage and off.



POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

ATTENDANCE

Consistent attendance is essential to the success of every Final Bow Music program. Because our music department emphasizes collaboration, each student's presence plays an important role in both their individual progress and the success of the group. Regular participation allows students to build skills consistently, develop confidence, and gain a deeper understanding of how their individual part contributes to the greater musical ensemble.

Before classes begin, families will receive a detailed syllabus outlining class times, rehearsals, performances, and other important dates throughout the season. It is important that students attend all scheduled classes and rehearsals, arrive on time, and come prepared to participate fully. While additional rehearsals may occasionally be necessary in preparation for performances or special events, these will be communicated directly to families with as much advance notice as possible.

Students should arrive dressed appropriately, with music, a pencil, water, and any required materials, and should use the restroom before class to minimize disruptions and avoid missing valuable instructional time.

If your student will be absent, please call or text (937) 459-8078 in advance. Excessive absences—or frequent tardiness—may result in removal from a piece/song, solos, or other performance moments to ensure the integrity of the production. Missed classes and rehearsals are nonrefundable.

If your family chooses to discontinue participation, written notice is required. Without official withdrawal, your account will continue to be billed until the proper forms are submitted.

We understand that school events, sports, and other activities may occasionally create conflicts. Please communicate any potential scheduling issues with us as early as possible. Students may be asked to prioritize commitments in order to remain performance-ready, confident, and fully integrated into the show.

ILLNESS

If your child has a fever, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or flu-like symptoms, please keep them home. Like school policies, students must be symptom-free for at least 24 hours without the use of medication before returning to class, performances, concerts, or events. We have students with compromised immune systems, so your cooperation is vital. If a child arrives ill, becomes ill, or is injured during class, we will contact you immediately for pick-up. Please note that Final Bow staff does not administer medication.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES (CONT.)

INCLEMENT WEATHER CLOSINGS & CANCELLATIONS

Final Bow follows Greenville City Schools for inclement weather closures. If weather conditions improve later in the day, we may hold classes as scheduled and will update you via the Final Bow VIP Facebook page, email, and text messages. Please ensure your contact information is current so you receive all communications. Weather-related cancellations may not be rescheduled. If an instructor must cancel a class due to illness or other emergencies, we will make every effort to reschedule the class.

BEHAVIOR

All students are expected to show respect toward their teachers, directors, fellow students, and all staff. At Final Bow, bullying, teasing, and any form of intimidation are not tolerated. We believe the performing arts should be a safe, creative, and encouraging space where every student feels confident to take risks and grow. If your child experiences any challenges with peers or classroom dynamics, please notify us promptly so we can address the situation.

Students who do not follow Final Bow's behavior guidelines will receive a fair warning. If negative behavior continues, the teacher or director will contact parents or guardians to discuss the issue. Should the behavior fail to improve, the student may be removed from rehearsals or performances. Please note that tuition or any additional fees are nonrefundable.

LOBBY AND STUDIO USE GUIDELINES

The lobby is designated as a waiting area for music students between classes and rehearsals. Due to limited space, we kindly ask parents and guardians to enjoy nearby downtown amenities or wait in their cars unless there is a specific need to come inside.

Please keep noise to a whisper at all times. Any individuals causing disruptions to rehearsals, classes, or office areas will be asked to leave.

Students and visitors are not permitted in studios, rehearsal rooms, or backstage areas outside of scheduled class or rehearsal times unless given explicit permission.

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES (CONT.)

Street shoes are permitted in the theatre rooms and Studio C, but not permitted in Studios A or B to protect the dance floors.

Final Bow is unable to provide a public restroom. Students must receive permission to go beyond the front counter area.

The lounge area is reserved for dance students only. Music students must remain in their designated waiting spaces unless otherwise instructed by a staff member. The kitchen may be used with staff permission, and any food must be eaten in the designated kitchen area. Students are expected to clean up after themselves.

Student access to Wi-Fi is intended for homework and school-related use only.

Any horseplay, excessive noise, or mess in shared spaces may result in the closure of those areas, and students will be asked to wait in the main lobby instead.

Only water is permitted as a beverage inside Final Bow.

We kindly ask that parents remain in the designated waiting area at the front of the studio and do not wander hallways or seek alternate seating elsewhere in the building. This helps us maintain a safe, monitored, and comfortable environment for all students.

DRESS CODE

There is no strict dress code for Final Bow Music students. Students should wear comfortable clothing that allows them to participate confidently. Clothing should be appropriate for a family-friendly learning environment and should be free from vulgar language or graphics. If a specific performance attire or concert dress is required, those expectations will be communicated directly to students and families well in advance.



AUDITIONS

At Final Bow Music, we believe that auditions are a valuable part of the musical learning experience. While not every ensemble or performance requires an audition, auditions may occasionally be used to assign solos, featured parts, leadership roles, chamber ensembles, or other special performance opportunities. Auditioning teaches valuable skills such as confidence, preparation, resilience, and professionalism. Every audition is an opportunity to grow as a musician, regardless of the outcome.

Our music faculty approaches each audition with an open mind. Decisions are never predetermined. Every student has the opportunity to earn solos, advanced parts, and additional performance opportunities based on their audition, preparation, attitude, musical growth, and the overall needs of each ensemble. We encourage all students to come prepared, give their best effort, and trust the audition process as an important part of their continued development as musicians.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Auditions may include:

- A prepared musical selection of your choice
- Preparation of a provided musical excerpt
- Sightreading
- Scales

Depending on the ensemble or performance, the audition process may vary slightly. Specific audition requirements will be communicated in advance.

PART ASSIGNMENTS

Assigning parts is a complex process that goes beyond selecting the "best" musician. Directors consider many factors, including musical ability, technical skills, intonation, rhythmic accuracy, tone quality, blend and balance, and the overall needs of the ensemble. Every part is essential, and each musician plays an important part in the success of the performance.

We ask students and families to respect the directors' decisions. Part assignments are final and are made with careful thought and the best interests of the entire ensemble in mind.

CLASSES AND ENSEMBLES

ADULT CHOIR

Adult Choir at Final Bow is a welcoming, inclusive ensemble designed for adults of all experience levels who want to develop their vocal skills, build meaningful community connections through the arts, and take part in public performances. Open to adults of all experience levels, from first-time singers to seasoned performers.

CRESCENDO CHOIR

Our Crescendo Choir is a fun, supportive ensemble, for students grades 3-6. Open to students of all skill levels, this ensemble fosters healthy vocal techniques, teaches basic music theory, and builds performances skills through engaging rehearsals, games, and age-appropriate songs.

VIRTUOSO VOICES

Virtuoso Voices is a skill-focused choral ensemble designed for motivated teen singers in grades 7-12. Open to students of varying skill levels, this ensemble prioritizes advancing vocal techniques and music theory knowledge, building independence in part-singing, and enhancing artistic expression.

FLUTE CHOIR

Final Bow Flute Choir is a performance ensemble just for flutists. Open to students in grades 7-12 and adults. Collaborate with fellow flutists, learning and performing musical arrangements across many genres and styles. Build independence on more individualized parts, grow your blending and balancing skills, and learn specialized tips and techniques to elevate your playing as an individual and ensemble member.



CLASSES AND ENSEMBLES (CONT.)

GROUP PIANO LAB

Group Piano Lab is designed to introduce students ages 8 through adult to the fundamentals of piano in a fun, low-pressure classroom setting. Open to individuals of any music experience, this course is an engaging and supportive way to learn. Students learn together while playing on their own digital piano, with headphones for focused, individualized learning. Digital pianos and headphones are provided for in-class use, and may be reserved for individual practice outside of class-time. In this course you can expect to learn - basic piano technique, how to read music, how to count rhythms, foundational music theory concepts, and more. No previous music experience necessary.

A replacement fee for damaged keyboards and headphones will be applied to student accounts in the event of damages. A \$50 replacement fee will apply for damaged headphones, and a \$100 replacement fee will apply for damaged keyboards.



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

The magic of music extends far beyond the stage. Every performance at Final Bow is made possible through the dedication of our incredible parent and family volunteers. Whether you have music experience or simply enjoy lending a helping hand, there is a place for everyone to be involved.

Parent volunteers not only help create a successful performance but also demonstrate to our students the value of teamwork, service, and community. Many hands make light work, and every contribution—big or small—makes a difference.

Volunteer opportunities may include:

- Stage Set Up – Help haul props and equipment to venue, and assist in preparing the stage.
- Decorating – Help bring each performance's theme to life by decorating the performance venue.
- Ushering – Welcome guests, distribute programs, assist with seating, and help create a positive audience experience.

VOLUNTEER OPPS. (CONT.)

- **Concessions & Merchandise** – Help sell refreshments, flowers, apparel, or other performance items during intermission and before the show.
- **Backstage Assistance** – Assist backstage with ensemble organization, coordinating performer transitions, monitoring behavior, and ensuring performances run smoothly behind the scenes.
- **Strike Crew** – Assist with returning the venue to its original condition after each performance, and hauling equipment back to the studio.
- **Ensemble chaperone** - Assist in chaperoning student ensembles that may be waiting their turn to perform.

Volunteer opportunities will be shared throughout the season, and no prior experience is necessary for most roles. Training and guidance will be provided as needed.

FINANCIAL AID ASSISTANCE

Final Bow is committed to making the arts accessible for every child. Families may request a Financial Aid Assistance Application from the office, offered twice per year. Awards may cover partial or full tuition based on demonstrated need and available resources. Recipients are asked to give back to the studio through volunteer hours as part of the program. Donations to our Financial Aid Fund are always welcomed to ensure these programs continue serving our families.

Each student is encouraged to sell a minimum of 15 tickets per fundraiser.

Dinner includes: Half chicken, cookie, chips, and a roll with butter.

Participation is strongly encouraged, and funds raised directly support Final Bow activities and performances.

DARKE COUNTY FOUNDATIONS SUNSHINE 5K

Join Team Final Bow at the annual Sunshine 5K, hosted by the Darke County Foundation each September. Proceeds benefit Financial Aid Assistance Program, providing performing arts opportunities for individuals with developmental and intellectual disabilities.

Music is a collaborative art form, and every ensemble requires an investment in materials before students ever step on stage. Your tuition helps ensure that Final Bow can continue providing meaningful performance opportunities while maintaining the high standards our students and families have come to expect.

TUITION & PAYMENTS (CONT.)

Payment Schedule

Music tuition is divided into three equal installments, with the full balance due prior to the final performance.

A \$10 late fee per month will be assessed on any unpaid balance after the scheduled due date.

Financial Aid Assistance is available for qualifying families. Please refer to the Financial Aid Assistance section of this handbook for eligibility requirements, application information, and important deadlines.

Statements are emailed on the last Thursday of each month, with payment due by the first Thursday of the following month.

All payments and deposits are non-refundable.

Payment Options:

- In Person at the Front Desk:

We accept checks, money orders, credit cards, or cash. If paying with cash, please bring the exact amount.

- Online:

Log in to the Parent Portal to pay by credit card online.

- Auto Pay:

Through the Parent Portal, set up automatic monthly tuition payments by credit card. Please note that auto pay does not cover additional charges (merchandise, DVDs, pictures, or other add-ons.)

To access the Parent Portal, visit www.finalbow.org and click the link to register for classes or manage your account.

If the person making payments has a different last name than the student, please write the student's full name in the memo line of checks to ensure proper credit is applied.

Please note that late fees over 30 days old will not be removed. Returned checks are subject to a \$35 fee. There is a 3% convenience fee for all credit card payments.

Please note, we strongly encourage cash and check payments. Final Bow loses .25-3.25% on every credit card transaction.

TUITION & PAYMENTS (CONT.)

Family & Multi-Program Discount

SIBLING DISCOUNT

We are excited to introduce a new sibling discount for our music program beginning this season.

For families with multiple children enrolled in music, discounts are applied as follows:

- 1st student: Full tuition
- 2nd student: 10% discount
- 3rd student: 15% discount
- 4th student: 20% discount
- Each additional student: An additional 5% discount

MULTI-DEPARTMENT DISCOUNT

Students who participate in more than one eligible Final Bow department are also eligible for a Multi-Department Discount. This discount follows the same structure as the sibling discount:

- Second eligible department: 10% discount
- Third eligible department: 15% discount
- Fourth eligible department: 20% discount
- Each additional eligible department: An additional 5% discount

The Multi-Department Discount encourages students to explore multiple areas of the performing arts while making participation more affordable for families.

MULTI-DEPARTMENT DISCOUNT EXCEPTION

The Multi-Department Discount applies to eligible Final Bow programs. Private music lessons, including those taught by Kat McNew and any future private lesson instructors, are not eligible for the Multi-Department Discount. Private lessons are independently administered and billed separately from Final Bow's standard tuition structure.

Students enrolled in Dance, Theatre, Choir, Group Piano, and other eligible Final Bow-operated programs remain eligible for the Multi-Department Discount according to the published discount schedule.

Only one discount may be applied to the same tuition charge. If a student qualifies for multiple discounts, the highest applicable discount will be applied.

FINAL BOW RULES & POLICIES

Final Bow is committed to providing a safe, respectful, and supportive environment where all students can thrive artistically and personally. To maintain this standard, all students and families are expected to adhere to the following policies:

General Conduct

- Students are expected to arrive prepared for class, dressed in the appropriate attire with correct shoes and hairstyle, and ready to learn.
- Horseplay is not permitted. Students who misbehave will be asked to sit out of class. Continued issues will result in parental contact and possible dismissal.
- Respect must be shown to all instructors, staff, board members, student helpers, volunteers, and fellow students at all times.
- Students are expected to arrive on time. Excessive tardiness or absences may result in removal from parts of performances or routines.

Personal Belongings and Classroom Etiquette

- All student belongings must be kept in designated areas inside labeled bags. Final Bow is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Please label everything.
- Cell phones must remain in bags and are not allowed during class.
- Students may not enter the studios unless a teacher is present.
- Hallways are not for loitering. Students should remain in designated waiting areas between classes.
- Water is the only beverage allowed inside Final Bow.

Building Use and Safety

- Restroom breaks should be taken before or after class to minimize disruptions.
- Students must remain inside the building until a parent or guardian arrives. No student may leave the property without a written note from a parent or legal guardian.
- Parents should use the Pedestrian Loading Zone for drop-off and pick-up only. If not using the loading zone, parents are required to walk to the door for drop-off and pick-up.
- Final Bow is not responsible for students left unattended in the waiting room, lounge, or parking lot.

Instructional Environment

- Teachers may use physical touch to safely and appropriately correct body placement and alignment in class. This is a standard practice in dance instruction.
- Absolutely no street shoes are permitted on the dance floors. Students must wear approved dance shoes only.

Zero-Tolerance Policy

- Final Bow maintains a zero-tolerance policy for the use or possession of illegal substances including, but not limited to: alcohol, tobacco, vape pens, drugs, and marijuana. Any student found in violation will be dismissed immediately, and legal authorities will be contacted if necessary.

COMMUNICATION

Clear and consistent communication is essential to the success of our music program. We are committed to keeping students and families informed throughout the season, and we ask that families partner with us by staying connected.

How We Communicate

The primary methods of communication for the music department include:

- **Band App** – Used for announcements, rehearsal schedules, reminders, and important updates.
- **Email** – Used for important information, invoices, performance details, and other department communications.
- **Final Bow Website** – Home to audition materials, calendars, registration information, forms, and additional resources.
- **Social Media** – Used to celebrate student accomplishments, promote performances, and share general announcements. Social media should not be relied upon as the primary source for important program information.

Stay Informed

The Music Department is committed to communicating proactively using the above methods. Families are responsible for checking these platforms regularly, as performance details, and other important information may change throughout the season. We appreciate each family's willingness to read communications in a timely manner and to help ensure that students are prepared for rehearsals and performances.
